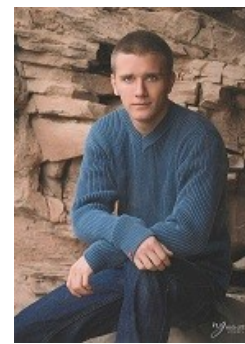
Juan Vega’s (Division 21) daughter Ana graduated from Roaring Fork High School on Saturday May 28th.

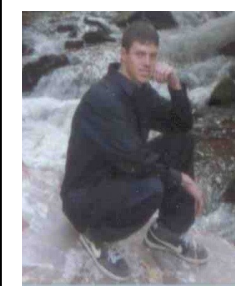
Kevin Hughey’s (Division 60) daughter Sarah graduated
