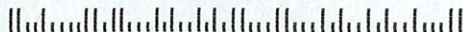

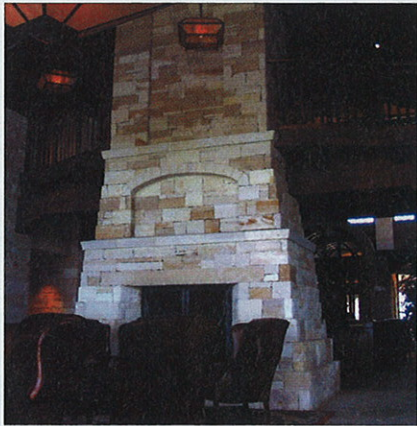


# Sanctuary Golf Course

Sedalia, Colo.

**T**he massive lobby fireplace at the Sanctuary Golf Course is designed for gas log sets and constructed as a wood-burning firebox. A Class A mechanical vent is encased in a CMU chase. Because the owner did not want glass doors on the see-through firebox opening, special ventilation was required to ensure proper draw of the gases. The main lobby entrance is located on one side of the firebox and 20-foot tall sliding doors open to the terrace on the other side, creating a situation where neither, one, or both could be open or closed as any time.

The stone veneer is highly detailed with cleft and snapped face Colorado buff sandstone. The 9-inch thick hearths had to be set in place before framing closed off access to the area. The firebox has a pair of 60-inch openings.
