Kansas State University Stadium

One of the most prominent projects TGC has been a part of this year is the Bill Snyder Family Stadium at Kansas State University. The KSU Football Stadium will be visited by more than 50,000 fans for every home football game and used by athletes from 16 different sports. With the final result impacting such a large group of people, the schedule for the renovation was an extreme challenge. Demolition was scheduled to begin at the end of the 2012 football season and reopen for the start of the 2013 season, with a \$1 million dollar per game liquidated damages clause for the first two games if the work was not complete. Our crew in Manhattan worked extremely hard to meet the deadlines, at one point working 27 days straight. Ben Spillner (60) said "Everyone on this job went above and beyond expectations. They were a tremendous team of guys. I just can't say enough about how hard they worked." Scott Christensen (60) added "This is an example of a




superlative effort from everyone involved, from the Estimators to the Project Managers to Field Operations. Steve Kalabany agreed with the sentiments by stating "I couldn't have asked for a better crew, and Ben really pushed the job."

While working under a strict timeline, our crews completed 80,000 square feet of stone work and 2,000 pieces of Cast Stone. Scott Christensen (60) said "The stadium is an example of high quality of work performed at a high rate of production." Steve Kalabany said "This normally would have been a 2 year project and was completed in 8 months. 75% percent of the work was done in the last 4 months. We were able to complete it because the entire crew was very dedicated and hard workers."

Thank you to everyone involved in the KSU Stadium, the Wild Cat fans will really appreciate it this fall

Apprenticeship Update

TGC received our official certification for an apprenticeship program through the Department of Labor! Joe Kleber (Concrete Superintendent) and Jennifer Law (10) attended a Master Trainer class to continue our certification process through NCCER (the organization who will be providing us curriculum). At this point in time, we have identified 12-15 people currently working in concrete to join the program. We anticipate starting classes the first week of September.

Additionally, Jen Law and Scott Christensen (60) have been working with RMMI (Rocky Mountain Masonry Institute) and CITC (Construction Industry Training Council) to join their Masonry Apprentice program which is scheduled to begin August 22nd. Those classes will be held at the CITC office at 646 Mariposa Street, Denver CO 80204 every Thursday from 3- 7 pm, with teleconferencing as an option. The program will last three years and follow a typical school year with breaks during the end of December and the summer months. The company will be assisting with the cost of the program for those employees who enroll and complete the course. We will be contacting current employees in masonry to gauge interest in participation. In the meantime, if you are interested in joining the program or know someone who is, please have them contact Human Resources ASAP for registration information.

We are excited to bolster our training programs with the formalization of an apprenticeship program!
