

Project Update: Vail's Solaris By Steve Kalabany & Geoffrey Soelter

It is impossible to miss the Solaris building as you drive into Vail. For the past two years, Gallegos has been hard at work on this project, and within a few months the entire project will be completed.

"We've been working on the exterior and interior, we have 65,000 square feet of stone in place, out of just over 100,000 square feet," said Steve Kalabany, project manager. "We've also started the exterior paving, which adds an additional 50,000 square feet of paving." The first phase has a completion date of March 10 with the balance scheduled for completion by the end of June.

The exterior has Oklahoma straight edge and sawn material as well as Colorado Buff stripstone. With the tenting and scaffolding beginning to come down, the building is starting to take shape.

Although the public cannot yet see the interior, it is just as stunning, Steve said. The lobby/lounge area is the focal point of the project, as it overlooks the plaza and Vail Mountain. It is 90 percent completed with coursed Oklahoma stone throughout. "The lobby came out really beautifully," Steve added.

Gallegos will be starting the pool lounge in the next couple of weeks, installing Carioca granite from Brazil.

In the spring Gallegos will start all the boulder work in the plaza on the south side of the building with the skating rink. The crew has already been working on 50,000 square feet of dimensional Buff sandstone paving.

Not only is Division 20 focusing on this project, concrete is almost complete, plaster is in progress, and the marble and tile have moved onsite, where they are currently working in the lobby.

Solaris plaster began on October of 2009 with a current projected substantial completion in April of 2010. Between that time 78 unit and common areas, consisting of half a million square feet of plaster, will have to be completed. The Gallegos Plaster Team is doing a great job maintaining the work load and providing solutions for a very sequentially complicated and high profile job with Mike Gifford leading the charge in the consistently challenging day to day field operations.

Gallegos Helps Move Mountains By Jake Jacobson

Gallegos had a part in helping remove snow cat traffic from Forest Road on Vail Mountain. Starting in August, Division 20 teamed with Site Resource Management and built a 1400 foot retaining wall on the mountain.



The snow cat maintenance facility is located across from the Vail Marriott. In the past snow cats would prattle up and down Forest Road. Now they use this road that allows easier access for snow cats from the maintenance area, which may someday be incorporated to the proposed Ever Vail project.

"You can actually see the road from the interstate," Jake Jacobson, division 20 president, said. "It's a real steep cut."

The crew of six to 10 men finished the project in just three months--a month before the deadline, the opening of the mountain for skiing. There are two walls about 700 square feet each—one that is mechanically stabilized earth on the mountain side and the other, an "innovative proprietary anchoring design" over a soil nail wall.



The technical aspects of this project include a 65-foot tall bell tower that cants (angles) out more than 12 feet from the base to the top of the tower. As with all current projects and the economy, the job is extremely tight with productions in excess of 55 square feet per day.

Dan Harrison is leading the charge for Gallegos and has been very instrumental in making this project come in on budget and on time. Along with Dan, we have masons Floyd Andreatta, Ceaser Cisneros, Ryan Larose, and Gregorio Lopez rising to the challenge of meeting these lofty productions.
